Talk to doctor before giving baby any medicines or home remedies Preventing Injury Never leave baby alone: o On a bed or changing table o With a stranger or a pet Never shake, toss, or swing baby in the air Never tie pacifier around neck Keep medicines, cleaning supplies, and plants out of child's reach
