◆ Walter Benjamin was born in 1892 of a wealthy Jewish family in Berlin. Unfit for service in World War I, he studied for a time in Bern, and returning to Berlin in 1920 tried unsuccessfully to found a literary review there, before turning to academic life as a career. His *Origins of German Tragedy* was however refused.

Walter Benjamin, since his death in 1940, has remained a cultural and literary champion. Scholars, critics, dialecticians, and historians have used Benjamin's words, forms and concepts to define and describe a vast array of seemingly unrelated ideas:
