Aspirin has been shown to reduce the risk of developing pre-eclampsia in women who are at increased risk of having this condition Pregnancy and high blood pressure High blood pressure which develops during pregnancy and goes away after your baby is born, is known as 'pregnancy

Good Health Before Pregnancy

Excess weight during pregnancy is associated with several pregnancy and childbirth complications, including high blood pressure, preeclampsia, preterm birth, and gestational diabetes Obesity during pregnancy also is associated with macrosomia, defined as a larger-than-normal baby, as well as an increased risk of birth injury and cesarean birth

years, there has been a shift in thinking from the high risk approach to focused ANC The high risk approach intended to classify pregnant women as "low risk" or "high risk" based on predetermined criteria and involved many ANC visits This approach was hard to implement effectively since many women had at least one risk factor,

Prenatal screening and diagnostic tests

pregnancy is at 'increased risk' of a birth defect Different screening tests are available in the first or the second trimester of pregnancy These results indicate the risk of the baby having Down syndrome A screening test does not give a definite answer, but it does tell us which babies have an

increased risk of having Down syndrome
