Principles of Renal Replacement Therapy Renal Replacement Therapy Renal replacement therapy is any treatment modality that seeks to replace the excretory function of the kidney Renal replacement always uses a semi-permeable membrane to achieve blood purification It can be intermittent or continuous, and can involve any of 4 major

Drug Dosing During Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy

Guidelines for Electrolyte Replacement

Guidelines are intended for patients with normal renal function Decreased dosage, and more frequent monitoring is advised in patients with renal insufficiency Monitor: Chem-7, ICa, and Magnesium Intravenous Phosphate Replacement for Patients receiving Parenteral Nutrition Serum Phosphate mmol/Kg of mmol dose for Level (mg/dL) Phosphate 70 Kg

Renal Dose Adjustment Guidelines for Antimicrobials CRRT ...

reductions in residual renal function may warrant a change in dosing strategy Residual renal function should be evaluated on a daily basis when making CRRT dosing plans • Monitor patients for interruption of CRRT (eg clotting) or changing filtration rates When CRRT is off, dose as hemodialysis patients or based on any residual renal
